

Our new pope is now almost ten months into his papacy, having begun his service on March 13, 2013. It is easy for me to remember that date because Bishop Tobin was visiting Fr. Reardon, the pastor of All Saints Parish, and me here in the rectory. We had written to him to tell him of our attempts to begin to do things together, anticipating the future when there will have to be the merging of parishes in our city. I had told Bishop that he really didn't need to come "way up here" because our plans were more wishes than facts, but he insisted on coming. When he was leaving the parking lot after our talk, some people on the street told me that there was white smoke in Rome which meant that we had a new pope. From the steps of the rectory I shouted that news to the Bishop leaving the parking lot. I believe he made it back to Providence in time to see the new pope emerge on the balcony of St. Peter's to give his first papal blessing. Do you remember what happened then? Before the new pope gave his blessing, he asked the people to bless him. And so he was off to his Franciscan start as pope. And Bishop Tobin later told people that he had been with a Jesuit the day the first Jesuit pope was elected. So that is our little bit of history for this past year. It won't make it into the magazines, but it was important for us here in Woonsocket.

Again my thanks to all who cleaned and decorated our church for the Christmas season and to our singers and servers. We have a beautiful old church. We have a beautiful old community. And we had a beautiful old Christmas—which, of course, is the best kind. May God bless us in this new year!
