Matthew 5: 38 - 48

#### **Focusing the Gospel**

#### To the point:

In this gospel, Jesus challenges us to ao beyond our expected responses to human interactions. But, challenging as they are, his examples of this "beyond" are nonetheless still finite human actions and limited love. Jesus' examples are shocking-but not nearly so shocking as what he really expects of us: "be perfect" as our "heavenly Father," who gives Life ("sun rise" and "rain") to "the just and the unjust" alike. Infinite actions. Limitless love. What a challenge!

#### Connecting the Gospel

#### To the First Reading:

The first reading is a selection from the holiness code of the book of Leviticus. When this book teaches we are to "Be holy" as God is holy, it is saying the same thing as Jesus who challenges us in the gospel to "be perfect" as our "heavenly Father." God's holiness is God's perfection.

### To Experience:

We encounter God's holiness or perfection in the traces of God's glory all around us. For example, the glory of a sunrise or the refreshment of a rainfall, or the radiant smile of an innocent child or the limitless love of a selfless caregiver.

Lent is beginning on March 1st this year. On Ash Wednesday there will be Mass at 9AM with distribution of Ashes and a Eucharistic Service with distribution of ashes at 7PM.

#### LIGHT FOR THE WORLD

In today's Gospel Matthew applies to Jesus the prophetic oracle of Isaiah: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone." In like manner, the psalmist's assertion that the Lord is my light is echoed in Jesus' words: "I am the light of the world; the man who follows me will have the light of life."

Christianity is about light. Just as Jesus is light to the world, so his church is to be light in a world of darkness. Light enables the beauty of things to be seen, and we are called to make the beauty of the world shine. But we are not to call attention to ourselves: if you are aware of the light in a room, it is too bright. Our vocation is for others, not ourselves.

Surrounded by discrimination, oppression and war, Christians are challenged to "be united in mind and judgment," and they are directed by God's love to "bring mankind to unity and peace." The light we bring to the world should lead in time to an end of all the world's darkness: the alienation and oppression of peoples, the attacks on human life and dignity, and disrespect for God's creation.
