Matthew 6: 24 - 34

#### Focusing the Gospel

#### To the point:

Telling humans not to worry about tomorrow is like telling them not to be the center of their own lives. And that is exactly the point of this gospel! The two masters are God or ourselves. Yes, we ourselves are the mammon. If we choose ourselves, we worry. If we choose God, we will feed on God's generosity, be clothed in God's gift of Life, and be made rich in faith. This choice is sufficient not only for a day but for a whole lifetime—even for all eternity.

#### **Connecting the Gospel**

#### To the First Reading:

Worry leads to nothing more than feelings of being forsaken. Choosing the God who can never forget us leads to nothing less than riches beyond measure.

#### To Experience:

Who doesn't worry? We worry about health and retirement, job security and education, family and friends. These are legitimate worries, but when they consume us, we become trapped in our own needs in ourselves. Only trust and faith in God can take us beyond the immediacy of worries and an inordinate focus on ourselves.

**GUIDELINES FOR LENT** - Lent is our time of preparation. During these 40 days, we ponder what it means to "give up, take up, and lift up". Using the spiritual practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we deepen our relationship with Christ and discern where God is working in our lives.

As Lent approaches on Ash Wednesday (March 1), please be aware of the following Lenten Regulations: Abstinence from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent (for those 14 and older) is required by Church law. Also, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting: those between ages 18 and 59 should eat less, meaning, take no solid food between meals and only one full meal that day. Serious health conditions excuse a person from these precepts. Parents are encouraged by the law of the Church to ensure that minors who are not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are educated nonetheless in an authentic sense of penance.

Following the implementation of the revised *Code of Canon Law* on November 27, 1983, the National Conference of Catholic Bishops in the US determined that the rules of fast and abstinence which have existed for the last several years in this country be maintained. <u>Namely, that the faithful observe suitable penitential practices on all Fridays throughout the year.</u> These penitential practices need not include abstaining from meat. However, as indicated above, the faithful must not eat meat on all the Fridays of Lent as well as on Ash Wednesday. They must also observe faithfully the fast regulations as they have been stated above in accord with the universal law of the Church.

## THE LOVE OF GOD

Today's liturgy is about love: "help us to love you with all our hearts and to love all men as you love them." It is also about justice: we are to "seek justice," following the Lord, who "secures justice for the oppressed," and following Christ, whom God has made "our wisdom and also our justice."

But God's love and justice are different from ours. The Gospel teaches us that in the just world of God, the sorrowing are consoled, the lowly inherit the land, the hungry have their fill, and the persecuted rejoice at being insulted and slandered. The children of God are different from the children of the world: "God chose those whom the world considers absurd to shame the wise; he singled out the weak of this world to shame the strong. He chose the world's lowborn and despised, those who count for nothing, to reduce to nothing those who were something."

The love of God is more powerful than all the sin we can muster, and the justice of God overcomes all the world's injustice, its poverty and hunger, its oppression and war, its alienation and domination of others. "The Lord sets captives free." May we be saved by the Lord's love.

Christian love of neighbor and justice cannot be separated. For love implies an absolute demand for justice, namely a recognition of the dignity and rights of one's neighbor. Justice attains its inner fullness only in love. Because every man is truly a visible image of the invisible God and a brother of Christ, the Christian finds in every man God himself and God's absolute demand for justice and love.
