Today is a "first" in the history of the Church with two popes, John XXIII and John Paul Ii, being canonized on the same day. For most of us these men are not distant figures but members of our immediate past, John XXIII was the old man (78 at his election) who surprised the Church and the world by his actions. Those who elected him pope in 1958 thought he would be a "caretaker" pope easing the Church into a new time after the long reign of Pius XII (1939-1958). His task was to be a John preparing the way for his successor. Indeed, he did take the name John, but he did so to honor his own father. That was something new. And off he went into newness, telling people that it was time for the Church to open the windows and let the Holy Spirit blow new life in. And so, horror of horror to his more conservative advisors, he called a council which then lived up to his vision of a renewed church, putting the liturgy into the vernacular so that people could calling other Christians understand it, "separated brethren," removing prayers offensive to Jews, and recognizing the separation of church and state as a model the Church could accept. So much for being old! And now another old man is walking in John's footsteps.

John Paul II was a young man (58) when he became pope and gave the papacy the energy and force of his powerful personality. When he went to his native Poland, the communist leader's knees were shaking when he met his fellow countryman, now pope. The fall of communism in Poland and then in Russia was due in no small part to his influence. Then we watched him age and become an old and sick man. But he insisted upon continuing until the Lord called him home. Thus he gave us an example of fidelity to the Lord's will.

We rejoice in celebrating these two men who gave their lives to the doing of God's will in their time, and we pray that their successor in the papacy, Francis, and we follow their examples in our time.
