It should be warm by now, but we are still in the forties and even lower at night. That is fine when there is sun, but without the sun it becomes too wintry to endure.

And at this time of the year in our city the one shelter for homeless men is now closed. That means on these cold nights there are men sleeping outside. Some have just blankets. have tents. That should not be. Yes, we can blame

them-at least some of them-for ending

up in this condition because of their addic-

tions to drugs or alcohol. But there are

others who are so limited mentally or psychologically that they cannot take care of themselves. The government of the city, it seems to me, should make sure that these men have a place to sleep and bathe all year round. Churches can help, but the

first resource should be the city itself.
