May slipped by too quickly. In January those of us who don't like the cold pray that the month will slip by quickly, but it doesn't. In May those of us who love the warm weather pray that the month may linger awhile, but it doesn't. What to do? But we lovers of warmth will treasure these coming months when we can open our windows and enjoy the outdoors.

June is a guiet time in the parish. Confirmation and Holy Communion are behind us. So too is the spring breakfast. It may give us time to look at the church beyond our particular parish. For example, we can watch the pope as he works in Rome and travels the world. This past week he was in Israel where he attempted, successfully, to meet with the patriarchs of the Orthodox Churches. Paul VI was the first pope in centuries to visit the Holy Land fifty years ago, when he too met with the Patriarch of Constantinople. Our church and the churches of the Middle East split apart a thousand years ago and have remained separated, with one minor and brief exception in the 15th century, until today. It has been the fervent prayer of the popes of these past fifty years to overcome this breach. If our church and the churches of the mideast were to unite, the universal church would then breathe again with two lungs rather than one. That is the image often used. Perhaps the differences between the two churches are more cultural than dogmatic. The difference between Greek and Latin in the liturgy was an important element at the beginning of our growing apart. Could we not learn to live with these cultural differences today for the sake of our unity in faith? We can and should.
