Rumor has it that last Monday there were nuns in full habit playing ball on a beach on the Cape. Hard to believe, is it not? After all, it is 2014, not 1960. I say 1960 because earlier than that nuns would not have been on a beach. Those who saw these nuns were delighted and took pictures of them. My own reaction is less enthusiastic. Fine, if they want to do that, God bless them! But I am a bit ambiguous about young women today who are going back to the habits of pre-Vatican II days. Yes, I do like some sign of religious commitment by women religious, but my own tastes go to a very simple sign. And what bothers me is that the women religious who in the 60s tried to answer the Church's call for simplicity in dress and an involvement in the world now look like "second-class nuns" precisely because they answered this call. These women have also suffered from Roman congregations who favor the newer and more conservative groups in full habits. That is sad. In the end, what matters is the following of the Gospel, the imitation of Christ. But it is amazing how differently different people interpret the Gospel and the imitation of Christ. I guess I should be more tolerant of those whose interpretation differs from my own. So I will refrain from telling these young sisters that, in my opinion, if they want to go to the beach, they should invest in bathing suits. But that is what I would like to say to them.

BELIEVE AND BE SAVED

The first line in the Gospel Reading is powerful: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." God's love for us is so great that he has found a way to bring us from death into life in Himself.

And what is that way? Well, as the Gospel says, you must believe in the only Son of God.

But what is it to believe in the Son of God? Believing in a person is not the same as believing that a claim is true, is it? To believe in a person is to trust that person for some things.

So to believe in the only Son of God is to trust him.

Trust him for what? Well, trust him to bring us from death into life. That is what the Gospel says, isn't it? God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.

So here is God's funny system. You are saved from death by believing in the Son of God, and you believe in him if you are willing to believe that he saves you from death. Your contribution to your salvation is to believe that God will save you.

Of course, it is important not to get mixed up here. Your contribution is not the self-congratulatory belief that you are saved, or the even funnier but equally self-flattering belief that you have belief in the Son of God. No, rather, your contribution is really to believe in the Son of God.

Think of it this way. If I say that I believe you are my only way of getting out of this burning building alive and then settle down to watch TV, what I say isn't true, is it? What I say turns out to be true only if I am glued on you, totally focused on following you out of that burning building. If I really believe you can save me from the building burning around me, I will certainly cleave to you now.

How much more should we cleave to the Savior when we believe in Him and trust him to bring us from death into life?
