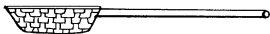

Let us make an act of faith in the power of prayer and believe that all the prayers which Pope Francis asked us to pray to avoid an increase of the war in Syria have been effective, at least in the sense that our nation is not going to attack Syria immediately. But we should keep praying that Russia and then the United Nations will help not only to remove chemical weapons from Syria but also to put an end to the war there. So many people have died already, and so many have been forced to leave their country.

As our planet becomes smaller and smaller, wrapped in consciousness through the miracles of modern technology, war should become obsolete, at least on a large scale. But small wars—and that would include civil wars—could continue. As long as they do, there is still work to do for all of us to make our world more human.

We have had a few projects going on here in our parish. The first was the sound system. It seems to be working well—except when the pastor doesn't replace the batteries. Now the work on our doors is almost at an end. They look beautiful. Next is the installing of two air-conditioning units in the basement which we can use when it is too hot to use the church. They will also make it possible for us to use the basement for other purposes during the warm weather.

We begin the fall of the year with school for the children and the Autumnfest for all of us. Our CCD classes will begin on the sixth of October, following the 9 A.M. Mass. May they go well!

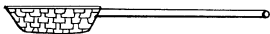
