PADRE'S PONDERINGS

A few weeks back, I was able to meet with the **diocesan Priests' Council** and present the proposal for the suppression of Saint Charles. The consultation was very helpful and I was able to answer questions that were raised by the members. We continue to await Bishop Tobin's decision.

Last Sunday, the **Saint Charles Legacy Committee** met for the first time. We had a very generous response from the parish community. Please mark the following events in your calendars:

- ◆ **Sunday, November 24, 3pm—Thanksgiving Ecumenical Prayer Service in Saint Charles:** Fr. Kiley will preside and I will preach at a service with representatives from other faith communities in Woonsocket.
- ◆ **Thursday, November 28, 9am—Parish Thanksgiving Day Mass in Saint Charles:** This will be the parish celebration of Thanksgiving Day for both All Saints and Saint Charles (please note: there will be no 8am Mass in All Saints on this day).
- ◆ **Sunday, December 1, 2pm—Church Tour of Saint Charles:** An opportunity to learn about the art and architecture of Saint Charles and their theological meaning and symbolism.
- ◆ **Sunday, December 15, 2pm—Final Christmas Concert followed by catered Parish Banquet in Saint Charles Church Hall:** This will be the final social gathering of our parish community. Tickets are free, but will be required in advance for the banquet.
- ◆ **Tuesday, December 24, 4pm—Final Christmas Eve Mass in Saint Charles Church**
- ◆ **Wednesday, December 25, 9am—Final Christmas Day Mass in Saint Charles Church**

If you would like to be a part of planning any of these events or helping to organize them, please reach out to me directly at 762-1100 or fatherupton@gmail.com. Please note that as we still await the Bishop's final decision, we still do not have a date for the final Mass in Saint Charles.

This coming week, we observe the parish patronal feast of All Saints, **The Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation**. A Vigil Mass will be held on Thursday, October 31, at 6pm in Saint Charles Church and the Mass of the Day will be held on Friday, November 1, at 8am in All Saints.

Please plan on joining us next Saturday for our **Christmas Bazaar**. I cannot thank our committee and volunteers enough for their hard and dedicated work.

In other news, at a **finance council meeting** this past week at All Saints, much serious discussion was had about the state of the finances and physical plant at All Saints, as well as what the closure of Saint Charles would mean for us. At some point in November, I will present a **"State of the Parish"** address at all of the Masses in place of a homily. I will share the financial report from the previous fiscal year, along with the amended budget for the present fiscal year and our first quarter financial report. Needless to say, we will have many challenges to face as a parish community. It is now time for us to engage in the same period of soul-searching, self-reflection and discernment that the good people of Saint Charles undertook in recent months.

Lastly, many thanks to **Lakesha and our dedicated catechists** for helping to prepare our parish young people for today's Family Liturgy!

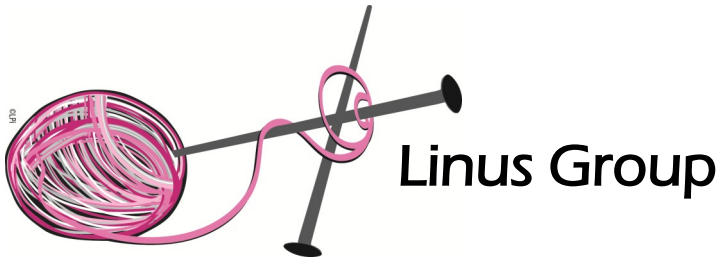

Linus Group

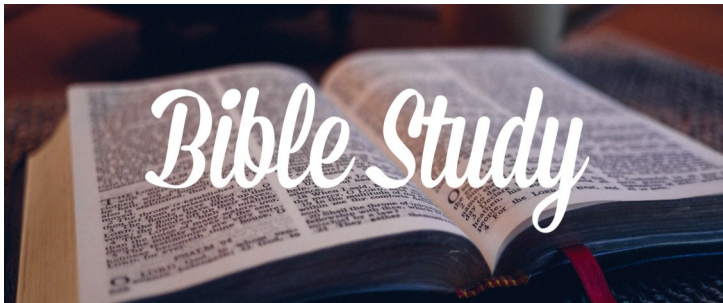

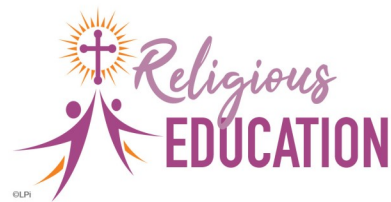

El domingo era el único día que Louis no trabajaba en la fabrica. Ese día iba caminando con toda su familia hasta la iglesia católica irlandesa St. Charles Borromeo de Woonsocket, (que quedaba a tres millas de distancia) para asistir a la misa. La religión católica era muy importante para las personas de Quebec. Querían tener su propia iglesia católica francesa.

On Sundays, the one day Louis didn't work in the mill, he and his family walked to Mass at St. Charles Borromeo, the Irish Catholic church in Woonsocket, three miles away. The Catholic religion was very important to the people from Quebec. They wanted their own French Catholic church.

From an exhibit in the Providence Children's Museum
