

Someone could ask what such dinners have to do with the living and preaching of the Gospel. The same question could also be posed with respect to the having of a bazaar. The answer in both cases is the same: they create community, and community has a great deal to do with the living and preaching of the Gospel. In days gone by a Catholic might well see his or her relationship with God and the Lord Jesus as a purely personal matter, but for the past half century or more, that is, from the days of Vatican II, we have been told that our personal relationship with God and the Lord Jesus cannot be purely personal but must also include a communal character. No one is a Christian alone. To be a Christian is to belong to a community of believers. That is what the sacraments themselves tell us. Baptism and Confirmation make us members of the community. The Eucharist is our communal celebration of our belonging to the mystery of the Lord's death and resurrection. Indeed, even in the past when priests sometimes celebrated Mass alone, they were told to have at least a server with them. So the communal element of the Eucharist was never forgotten, even when not emphasized. And this month we celebrate our communion with those who have gone before us in faith and are now with God. It is the month of All Saints and All Souls, themselves communities. So, yes, bazaars and dinners have much to do with the living and preaching of the Gospel.
