Estimados miembros de la comunidad hispana:

Una de las grandes alegrías de mi tiempo aquí en Todos los Santos ha sido ministrarte y conocerte. ¡Tu comunidad es de fe vibrante y alegría santa! Gracias por todo lo que hace fielmente por nuestra comunidad parroquial. Como administrador temporal aquí, ha sido mi tarea evaluar cuáles son las necesidades de su comunidad y cuál es la mejor manera de satisfacerlas. Las dos cosas que decidí hacer cuando conocí mejor a su comunidad fueron las siguientes: (1) Asegurarme de que tuviera un cuidado pastoral estable y accesible de un sacerdote que pudiera atenderlo en su propio idioma y (2) Proporcionar un hogar parroquial estable para apoyar a su comunidad. Por desgracia, no soy el cura, que será capaz de proporcionar el mejor cuidado para ustedes y La parroquia de Todos los Santos ya no es una que puede proporcionar un hogar estable en el futuro previsible. Su comunidad necesita un sacerdote de habla hispana y una parroquia que sea financieramente estable para que su comunidad pueda seguir creciendo y prosperando. El domingo pasado, yo, junto con el diácono José, P. Sweet y Lakesha, nos reunimos con algunos de los líderes de su comunidad. Hemos discutido la situación con honestidad, la claridad y la transparencia. Todos hemos estado de acuerdo, incluso el P. Nolasco y Silvio Cuellar, que el mejor arreglo es reubicar su comunidad a un nuevo hogar en Holy Trinity, donde el P. Sweet y su parroquia te darán una cálida bienvenida y continuarán beneficiándose de los muchos regalos que traes. Esperamos completar esta transición en enero. Sé que este movimiento no fue planeado, a pesar de que se discutió en el pasado, y puede ser una sorpresa. Pero le pido que recuerde que las personas a quienes se ha encomendado su comunidad realmente creen, después de mucha discusión y oración al Espíritu Santo, que este es el mejor movimiento para estabilizar su comunidad y ayudarlo a continuar creciendo. Aliéntense unos a otros en este proceso. Si bien Todos los Santos ha sido su hogar, y nunca es fácil mudarse, todavía es una familia. Quiero que pienses en este proceso como un movimiento que cualquier familia haría de un hogar a otro. Todos los enlaces y conexiones que ha formado, todo el trabajo bueno que está haciendo, todos los ministerios que tiene, todo lo que hace que una familia, viajará con usted a su nuevo hogar. Nada de eso se perderá. El edificio será diferente, pero mientras la familia permanezca unida, no se pierde nada. Entonces, por favor, permanezcamos juntos como familia durante este proceso. Llegar a los líderes de nuestra comunidad si tiene alguna pregunta o inquietud. Cada uno de ustedes es importante para esta comunidad, cada uno de ustedes es valorado y necesitamos que todos y cada uno de ustedes ayuden a nuestra familia a hacer

esta transición a nuestro nuevo hogar. Reza a Nuestra Santa Madre, también. Ella nos ayudará en este proceso. En enero, el Diácono José y yo dirigiremos nuestra comunidad en oración con la Virgen de Guadalupe. Luego, traeremos su imagen que ha colgado en Todos los Santos, con nosotros a Holy Trinity, donde el P. Sweet y su comunidad nos darán la bienvenida a nuestro nuevo hogar y entronizarán a Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe allí. Ella nos guiará, ella va a caminar con nosotros, que nos animará. Entonces, por favor, comprenda que este es un movimiento bueno y necesario, que fortalecerá a su comunidad. ¡Pero debemos permanecer juntos como una familia! Vamos a orar unos por otros y por favor, llegar a mí o Diácono José o Lakesha si tiene alguna pregunta o inquietud.
