This weekend we begin the Season of Advent, our preparation for the Lord's coming to us as a concrete, human person, one "like us in all things but sin." Hence the fundamental joy of Christian faith since it confesses that God loves us so much that He created the world in order to become part of it in one single person and thereby make all of us members of His own Divine family. We rejoice therefore as we begin our celebration of Advent.

There are two other events which we wish to celebrate this week. The first is the fiftieth anniversary of two of our lectors. Arthur Keegan and John (Ron) Bibeault began reading at Mass here at St. Charles in November 1964 when the Second Vatican Council established lectors as permanent ministers at the celebration of the Eucharist. We salute, congratulate and thank them for their fifty years of service to our parish in this capacity. May they continue in this service for many years to come!

The second is the celebration "Consecrated Life" in our church throughout the world. Consecrated Life, also called Religious Life, refers to those who have taken vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. Pope Francis has proclaimed 2015 as the year dedicated to this celebration. Please read about our celebrating it here in the Diocese of Providence in the next column.

There are three reason why we should take part in this celebration. First, Sister Jacqueline Dickey, SSCh, who is the diocesan director of Office for Religious, is a member of our parish and lectors here. Second, the Brothers of the Sacred Heart live in and worship at our parish. And third, two Jesuits, that is, religious priests, serve in this parish.

#### WANDERING OFF

In the reading from Isaiah, the prophet is longing for the love of God. But what he finds instead is what he cannot bear: God angry, God gone. The experience the prophet gives voice to is familiar to all of us. God is angry and has hidden his face; he is somewhere above the heavens, and we cannot find him there.

How can this be? How can this be? Doesn't God love us? Where is he? Why isn't he here?

The prophet answers these questions, but in the saddest way. The reason lies in our sinfulness, the prophet says. God is not gone from us because he has forsaken us. Our sins—our weaknesses, our willfulness, our pride, our failure to love, our failure even to accept the love of others—all these things have made us wither. Desiccated and unclean, we have been blown away from God by the winds of life.

But how are we supposed to be holy, clean and good for the Lord, except by the Lord's own doing? We reject as Pelagian the thought that any one of us can make himself holy by his own efforts. Only God's grace can make a person lovely in holiness.

And so the prophet cries out to God, "Why do you let us wander, O Lord, from your ways?"

There is an answer in the Psalm. The Psalmist says, "Lord, make us turn to you!" This is a cry from a person who wanders from the Lord. And he wanders because he wants to. But when he cries, "make me turn to you!, his heart wants not to want the wandering it is so prone to want.

And so maybe God lets us do what we want to do, including wandering from him, until we at least want to want him. Maybe we will find him when we can cry with Psalmist, "Lord, make me turn to you!"
