

PADRE'S PONDERINGS

Dear Parishioners,

What a joy to be able to welcome the season of Advent, the great season of hope and expectation! Advent reminds us that amid all the busy-ness and bustle of this time of year, we need to be still. The buying and shopping and prepping and decorating and all of the frantic running around that accompany them are distractions from the true message of the Christmas season: when we least expect him, God arrives, and never in the way we imagine. Advent prepares our hearts for change, for new beginnings, for breaking old habits and taking off the blinders. God is coming! And we need to be ready to welcome him.

Advent, because it is a season of hope and because it fixes our sight on the future, is a good time for us as a parish community at All Saints to reflect on our future. That will require some change on our part, but it will also require some vision. I had breakfast with a very good friend recently who reminded me, "We talk of God having a 'plan,' but God doesn't have a plan, God has a vision!" I couldn't agree more. A plan is about practicalities, strategies, mechanics. No one can get behind a mere plan. Vision is bigger! A vision is more daring, it requires greater risks, but it is worth getting behind, buying into.

Since I arrived at All Saints five months ago, I have stated plainly that my principal tasks were to assess the needs of the community and to stabilize the parish. I—with the support of our staff, parish trustees, and finance council—am taking steps to actively secure our parish financially. These steps are being taken in accord with a vision for the parish that focuses our resources on outreach to the poor and the marginalized.

All Saints has weaknesses, yes, but it has many strengths. It believe that we need to play to our strengths. It has an impressive history of outreach to the poor and the marginalized. I want to strengthen those ministries and secure them for the future. It has a dedicated group of parishioners who worship and donate weekly to our parish. I want to encourage them and give them reason to keep coming and contributing to our cause. It has a group of talented and loyal leaders who are willing to assume greater responsibility for our community. I want to work with them in securing the future of our parish and in creating a shared vision.

You already have an idea of our weaknesses. We are facing serious difficulties with our physical plant. Demographically, we are not a young parish. We are not able to provide for youth and family programming as well as other parish communities. But none of those things mean that All Saints doesn't have a future. We just need to define what our future will look like.

Here's what I see in our future. I see another holiday bazaar that not only brings in much-needed revenue, but

more importantly, brings more and more parishioners together. I see our food services strengthened and growing, enabling them to serve more hungry people. I see our Adopt-a-Family program giving out more presents than ever before. I see our Meat Raffle continue to generate revenue and, most importantly, community. I see greater returns for our toy drive and coat drive and our participation in ROVAC. I see our Linus crafts going to even more people who need them. I see us expanding our outreach to people in recovery and partnering with Deacon John Silvia on St. Mathias Ministry. I see us expanding our outreach to victims of domestic abuse and partnering with Carol Owens on Pathway to Peace. I see us taking in even more baby items for St. Gabriel's Project. All of this and more is possible if we work together with a shared vision!

In the coming weeks, be on the lookout for information about the institution of a Parish Council, which will include representative members of the parish community. As Jeff Gaulin and Nel Savaria, our parish trustees, and I will be working at reconstituting our Finance Council, both of these representative groups will provide a wider participation from a greater number of people to participate in developing solutions to our problems and in crafting a vision for our parish. I will be looking forward to sharing more information about both of those councils in the coming weeks.

As I said in my remarks at all Masses last month, please be patient with me. I know there will missteps but I am trying my very best to help secure the future of our parish community.

On another note, please consider joining us for the tour of Saint Charles Church today (Sunday) at 2pm. One of the most difficult aspects of the process of closing a parish is saying goodbye to a space that is not only so beautiful but also so meaningful to a great many people.
