

When life is normal and routine, we can get bored. But when an accident occurs, we long for the ordinary. The liturgical calendar is on to this dynamic of human life. There is ordinary time, but twice a year ordinary time gives way to what we might call extraordinary time. So we have Advent and Lent and the Easter Season following Lent. If we look at these extraordinary times in the Church's calendar, we can see that they emphasize key elements of our faith. Advent is the time when we prepare for the twofold coming of the Lord Jesus, first in the flesh as a baby entering into human history, and second as the judge of the world on the Last Day. Lent leads us into the last days of our Lord's life, his trial and suffering and death, and is followed by the celebration of his rising to new life at Easter. So these times remind us of the essential truths of our faith: the Incarnation, the Last Judgment, the Lord's life and his suffering and death, and his resurrection. And we who follow these times in the Church's calendar allow them to shape our lives, to give them their frame of reference. That is important. Without such a frame, our lives have no shape except the one given it by nature (the seasons) and by the popular culture, and the popular culture is not always a good reference. So, as we make our way through Advent once again, let us pray that we may be people who live in expectation of the Lord's two comings and allow our lives to be shaped by them.
