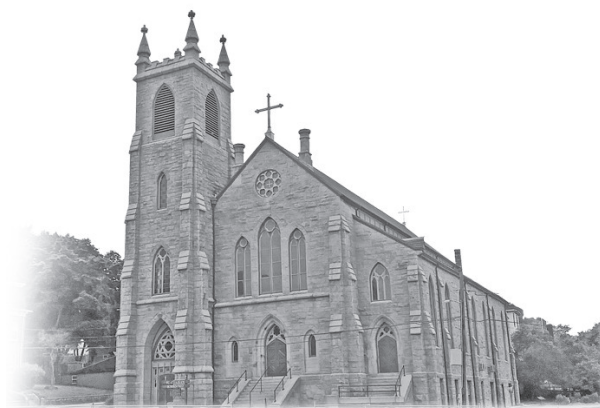
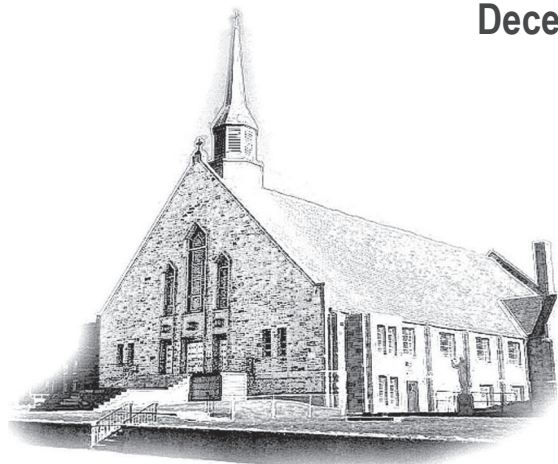

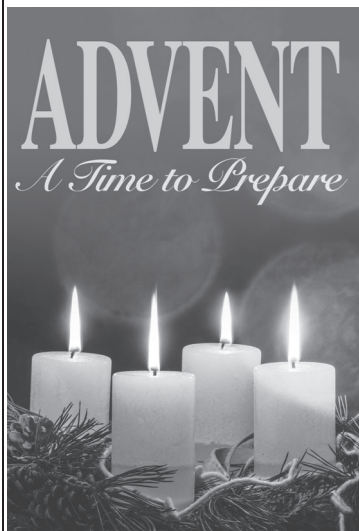

Report of Multi-Parish Cooperative Meeting

A Joint Meeting of members of the Finance Committees and Diocesan Planning Committees from: All Saints', St. Charles', and St. Stanislaus' Churches was held on November 27th. This was the first combined meeting of these groups that also included Father Darius, Deacon Gallo, and Christine Daneault, Finance Administrator for St. Charles and All Saints.

While a wide variety of topics were discussed by attendees, the purpose of this initial meeting was primarily twofold: First, to identify many of the challenges that each of our individual communities is facing including- but not limited to: declining attendance at masses; the chronic shortage of available priests to say Masses or to serve as pastors; and the costs associated with the maintenance of our many properties.

And Second, but more importantly, to establish a forum in which a cooperative plan can be developed that will address the essential spiritual, social, and practical needs of our now mostly separate communities that can survive those challenges that we now face. This is an opportunity to determine our own future, instead of having it forced upon us.

In early January, a smaller workgroup with representative of each community will meet to define and prioritize the tasks and next steps that we need to take in order to move forward. A report of this meeting will be made available to all.

The Blessed Sacrament

The daily exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at All Saints Parish has been closed. According to Canon Law and liturgical regulations the Blessed Sacrament can only be exposed if there are people present in adoration. This has not been happening and consequently the Blessed Sacrament has been perpetually left alone.

If we cannot keep our Blessed Lord company, we have no choice but to stop the practice of daily exposition. However, if there are enough people who will sign up and commit to an hour of adoration on a given day we would restore perpetual adoration. Let us try to start the restoration on the first Friday of January 2019. If at least four people will commit to an hour of adoration on Fridays, that is, being present in the church, then beginning on January 4, a partial restoration can begin. We can grow it from there depending on individual commitment.

Mass continues as scheduled at 8am. Adoration would follow in hourly intervals. Please consider signing up:

Informe de la Reunión Cooperativa Multi-Parroquial

Una reunión conjunta de miembros de los Comités de Finanzas y Comités de Planificación Diocesanos de las iglesias de Todos los Santos, San Carlos y San Estanislao se llevó a cabo el 27 de noviembre. Esta fue la primera reunión combinada de estos grupos que también incluyó al Padre Darius, Diácono Gallo y Christine Daneault, Administradora de Finanzas de San Carlos y Todos los Santos.

Si bien los asistentes discutieron una amplia variedad de temas, el propósito de esta reunión inicial fue principalmente doble:

Primero, para identificar muchos de los desafíos que enfrenta cada una de nuestras comunidades individuales, entre los que se incluyen, entre otros, los siguientes: disminución de la asistencia a las masas; la escasez crónica de sacerdotes disponibles para celebrar misas o para servir como pastores; y los costos asociados con el mantenimiento de nuestras muchas propiedades.

Y segundo, pero más importante, establecer un foro en el que se pueda desarrollar un plan de cooperación que aborde las necesidades espirituales, sociales y prácticas esenciales de nuestras comunidades, ahora en su mayoría separadas, que puedan sobrevivir a los desafíos que ahora enfrentamos. Esta es una oportunidad para determinar nuestro propio futuro, en lugar de que nos lo impongan.

A principios de enero, se reunirá un grupo de trabajo más pequeño con un representante de cada comunidad para definir y priorizar las tareas y los próximos pasos que debemos seguir para poder avanzar. Un informe de esta reunión se pondrá a disposición de todos.

El Santísimo Sacramento

La exposición diaria del Santísimo Sacramento en la parroquia de Todos los Santos ha sido cerrada. De acuerdo con el derecho canónico y los reglamentos litúrgicos, el Santísimo Sacramento solo puede exponerse si hay personas presentes en la adoración. Esto no ha estado sucediendo y, en consecuencia, el Santísimo Sacramento se ha dejado siempre solo.

Si no podemos mantener a nuestro Señor Bendito en compañía, no tenemos más remedio que detener la práctica de la exposición diaria. Sin embargo, si hay suficientes personas que se inscriban y se comprometan a una hora de adoración en un día determinado, restauraremos la adoración perpetua.

Intentemos comenzar la restauración el primer viernes de enero de 2019. Si al menos cuatro personas se comprometen a una hora de adoración los viernes, es decir, al estar presentes en la iglesia, a partir del 4 de enero, puede comenzar una restauración parcial. . Podemos crecer a partir de ahí dependiendo del compromiso individual.

La misa continúa según lo previsto a las 8 am La adoración seguiría en intervalos de una hora. Por favor considere registrarse:

8: 30-9: 30am // 9: 30-10: 30am // 10: 30-11: 30am // 11: 30-12: 30pm
