As we step into a new year, our thoughts turn to ideas of reform. After all, we all know about New Year's resolutions. We also know that we often fail to keep them. Why is that? Were we not really convinced of the goodness of the resolution that we made? Maybe we didn't put our whole weight behind it. There is a difference between decisions which we make with "all our hearts" and those we make with "half a heart." Even the first kind, those made with all our hearts can be changed, but with more difficulty than those which we have made "halfheartedly." Maybe not for Hollywood stars, but for most people marriage decisions are made with the whole heart. That is why their removal causes great pain. A person is truly turning himself or herself totally around. That is not the case with a decision about a diet or a daily walk. We make them, at least most of the time, somewhat halfheartedly. And that is right in a sense, because such decisions are not that important. They are helpful, but they do not call for an about-face in our lives. Of course there are exceptions. When we are told that if we do not lose weight, our life may possibly be in danger, then a decision about our diet begins to move into the whole-hearted category. It may be a matter of life or death.

Resolutions and decisions are the bread and butter of human life. Other animals don't make decisions. They act on instinct. We act on reflection. And our relationship with God is based on our decisions. Indeed, all our relations are based on decisions. Our faith tells us that grace precede all our decision. The saints remind us that it is grace which makes our actions possible. And yet decisions come in as the answer to God's graceful promptings. As we begin our new year, let us ask God for grace so that we may make the right decisions in our life this coming year.
